<u>HEBREWS 12:14</u> Pursue peace with all people, and holiness, without which no one will see the Lord

- Recap: Last time, we discussed the idea God's call to holiness, is more a plea for intimacy with His children He desperately loves, than it is a call to a change of lifestyle.
- God's purpose for His call to holiness, is that we'd be separate from anything that may come in between our relationship with Him.
- <u>"Working out"</u> your salvation means "living out" or "showing" and "bringing to the front" the salvation that's been deposited in you by God's incorruptible Word

- I. The cares of this world
- being concerned that God won't take care of us as He promised He would:

MATTHEW 6:25-34

Being overly concerned with things that have no eternal value

2. The deceitfulness of riches

- Riches become deceitful when we expect them to do, what only God can. For example, bring peace, joy, fulfillment
- Riches become deceitful when our affections are on them instead of Jesus
- Riches become deceitful when we become selfish, greedy or proud.

3. The desire for other things

• When we pursue other things so much that we don't seek the Kingdom of God first.
