FRUITFULNESS (5) 2019-02-24

JOHN 15:1-17

- <u>Recap:</u> Previously, we discussed that God want's His will done, through our asking. God trusts us to bear MUCH FRUIT because He is a God of excellence.
- This week, we'll discuss vs 8-10

vs8"so you will be My disciples."

God is saying, we'll be recognised like this:

JOHN 13:35 By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another.

- A characteristic of a disciple, is that they bear much fruit, the fruit of love
- If me going to church and doing courses etc. is not making me like Jesus, then what's the point?
- Am I really growing and learning to love like Jesus did?
- This love is more than just "love your neighbour as yourself" (see MARK 12:31)
- The growth of our love should look like this: love yourself, love your neighbour, then: **JOHN 13:34** A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another
- It all starts by realising how much we're loved by God.

vs9"As the Father loved Me, I also have loved you; abide in My love.

- A constant awareness of God's love for us, will help us through difficult times, that are otherwise hard to understand. Eg. "why is this happening to me?"
- A constant awareness of God's love, will help us believe this verse:

ROMANS 8:28 And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called *according to His purpose*.

- The primary purpose of God's call on our lives is into a love relationship, not a service contact
- vs9 "abide in my love"
- We must live (abide) with an overwhelming awareness of God's love for us, instead of being driven by the things we feel we have to do for Him

vs10<u>If you keep My commandments</u>, you will abide in My love, just as I have kept My Father's commandments and abide in His love."

- It's interesting to note that vs10, gives us the "how to" of abiding in love, by keeping Jesus' commandments. (MARK 12:30-31, JOHN 13:34)
- A strong commandment, to keep love from going cold.

MATTHEW 24:12 And because lawlessness will abound, the love of many will grow cold

- A strong prophetic word from Jesus, so it's going to come to pass and currently is
- If you *keep* my commandments: Love is an action not a feeling:

JAMES 2:26(b) faith without works is dead also.

It's possible to serve without loving but it's impossible to love without serving
